Dear Mr. McMillan,

Pursuant to California Public Records Act, please find below the Inyo County Registrar of Voters' response to your request dated December 30, 2020, received on January 4, 2021. As you may recall, an extension was necessary and timely submitted to you. As such, the County's response was due on or before January 28, 2021.

As a general matter, the Inyo County Registrar of Voters maintains a website dedicated to elections: <https://elections.inyocounty.us> where a number of records potentially responsive to your request are located. Please review that website to locate information regarding election results, including our 2020 Risk Limiting and 1% Manual Hand Tally Audit, as well as press releases relating to the November 2020 election at issue in your requests.

As discussed below, several of the requests seek voter registration information and voter history. Voter registration information, including voter history, can be applied for and purchased pursuant to Sections 2188 and 2194 of the Election Code, as well as California Code of Regulations, title 2, section 19001, et seq., which among other things, require the submittal of an application form as specified in California Code of Regulations, title 2, section 19008. Provide those documents which reflect notifications from the Secretary of State requesting or directing modifications to a voter's registration record between September 1, 2020 and November 15, 2020.

Additionally, some of your requests seek sensitive information security records such that disclosure of the record would reveal vulnerabilities to, or otherwise increase the potential for an attack on, an information technology system of the Inyo County Registrar of Voters and the County of Inyo. As such, the County intends to produce certain policies and procedures that do not reveal vulnerabilities or increase the potential of a cyberattack.


