Re: Public Records Act Request – General Election, November 3, 2020

This letter is in response to your request for public records made to the Lake County Registrar of Voters on April 6, 2021. With two exceptions, all discernable public records responsive to this request which are subject to disclosure, are provided here. The first exception is in response to question number 33. While documents will be provided, the breadth and scope of that production will require the Registrar to invoke the additional 14 days available pursuant to Government Code section 6253, subdivision (c). The second exception is in response to question number 60. Although documents have been provided in part, further response will require a more involved search. Accordingly, the Registrar's anticipated date of production in response to question numbers 33 and 60 will be April 30, 2021. The Registrar's complete responses to your request are as follows:

1. Provide those documents identifying, by date, time and means, all synchronization transmissions between the California Secretary of State and the county Registrar of Voters.

Response: The Registrar has determined that it possesses no records responsive to this request.

2. Provide those documents with the results of each synchronization transmission between the California Secretary of State and the county Registrar of Voters, by number of registrants confirmed as valid, and those that are identified as invalid.

Response: The Registrar has determined that it possesses no records responsive to this request. However, the Registrar will make available memoranda to all County Clerks/Registrars of Voters from the Secretary of State, dated June 16, 2020 and March 5, 2021.

3. Provide those documents which reflect notifications from the Secretary of State requesting or directing modifications to a voter's registration record between September 1, 2020 and November 15, 2020.

Response: The Registrar has determined that it possesses records responsive this request. Please see attached.

4. Provide those documents that reflect, in summary form, the modifications to the voter registration record, by date, time, and by any unique voter registration number or name of voter, for those records modified between September 1, 2020 and November 15, 2020.

Response: The Registrar has determined that without data compilation, extraction, or programming to produce a copy of a record with the requested data, it possesses no records responsive to this request. Response: To the extent that the County has potential responsive documents that describe potential vulnerabilities, or otherwise increase the potential for an attack on the information technology system associated with the Registrar of Voters and the County, these records are exempt from disclosure pursuant to Government Code sections 6254(aa), 6254.19, 6255, and 2 CCR § 19064.

7. Provide those documents, i.e., logs, narratives of inspection, created between September 1, 2020 and November 15, 2020 reflecting "active management (tracking, reporting, and correction) of the security configuration of laptops, servers, and workstations in order to prevent attackers from exploiting vulnerable services and settings" took place in compliance with 2 CCR § 19064(c)(3).

Response: After a diligent search for records, the Registrar has determined there are no records responsive to your request. The Registrar does not use wireless local area networks, access points or wireless client systems. However, note that records that describe potential vulnerabilities and the County's resolution of such risks, are exempt from disclosure pursuant to Government Code sections 6254(aa), 6254.19, 6255 and 2 CCR § 19064.

12. Provide those documents, i.e., logs, narratives of inspection, created between September 1, 2020 and November 15, 2020 reflecting the inventory and identification of all wireless-capable devices in the County's ballot processing location.

Response: As we understand your request, and after a diligent search for records, the Registrar has determined there are no records responsive to your request. The counties have been divided into three groups for the SOS initiated sync checks:

- Group A will be scheduled for sync checks between 5:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. on Friday-Saturday of the first week of the month.
 - Los Angeles County will be scheduled for an additional sync check between 5:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. on Friday-Saturday of the third week of the month, if needed.
- Group B will be scheduled for sync checks between 5:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. on Wednesday-Thursday of the second week of the month.

County sync statistics will be consolidated and sent to all counties on a weekly basis. SOS will not initiate sync checks in a county per the schedule outlined below for the following situations:

LAKE COUNTY, Calif. – While thousands of Lake County residents already have returned their ballots early this year – a measure encouraged due to the pandemic – county elections officials plan to welcome thousands more to local polling places for Tuesday's presidential election.

Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

There are

22 polling sites

(http://www.lakecountyca.gov/Assets/Departments/RegistrarOfVoters/Nov+2020+Election/PollingPlaces around the county, the same number as in past years, with Registrar of Voters Maria Valadez implementing COVID-19 safety guidelines to ensure voters can safely vote in-person.

The Lake County Registrar of Voters Office is using the Board of Supervisors' chambers on Tuesday for voting activities in order to allow for social distancing for voters wanting to cast their ballot at the courthouse.

In addition, ballot drop boxes will be available until 8 p.m. Tuesday at the following locations:

- Lake County Courthouse, 255 N. Forbes St., Lakeport.
- Lakeport Library, 1425 N High St., Lakeport.
- Middletown Library, 21267 Calistoga Road.
- Redbud Library, 14785 Burns Valley Road, Clearlake.
- Upper Lake Library, 310 Second St.

Ballots must be delivered to the drop boxes, the registrar's office at the courthouse or to the polls by 8 p.m. Tuesday.

Any ballots being returned by mail must be postmarked on Tuesday to be accepted and counted; Valadez suggests people mailing their ballots request postal workers postmark them in their presence to ensure they meet the requirements.

This year, state law is allowing for ballots that are postmarked to be accepted up until 17 days after Election Day.

For those who missed the October deadline for voter registration, this year for the first time they may participate in "same day" – or conditional – voter registration. This registration process can take place at the county elections office, polling place or vote center. Those ballots will be processed and counted once the county elections office has completed the voter registration verification process.

The Registrar of Voters Office, located in Room 209 on the second floor of the Lake County Courthouse in Lakeport, will be the central counting place of the official ballots of all voting precincts for the General Election, Valadez said.

Processing of vote by mail, or absentee, ballots returned early began on Oct. 13, and scanning and adjudicating of the official ballots commenced on Monday, Oct. 26, the Registrar of Voters Office

reported.

Valadez said tallying of the official ballots will begin after the close of the polls at 8 p.m. Tuesday, at which time her office will begin to release reports on results throughout the night, which will be posted on her website.

However, as has been the case in past elections, results are not expected to be complete on Tuesday night, and the election won't be certified and considered final until the rigorous official canvass process is completed.

County elections offices have until Dec. 1 to report their final reports for the presidential race and Dec. 4 for other state and federal contests, the Secretary of State's Office reported.

As part of the ongoing process to protect our elections, the California Secretary of State's office has developed a "Recommendations for Minimizing Cyber Risk" document, which election officials are encouraged to share with political parties, committees and candidates.

The recommendations included in the document are intended to reduce the likelihood and severity of cyberattacks in the March 3, 2020, Presidential Primary Election.

To help protect the integrity of our elections, the Secretary of State's office is requesting that you provide the document to candidates during the:

- Signatures-in-Lieu of Filing Fees Period (Sept. 12 Nov. 6, 2019)
- Declaration of Candidacy and Nomination Period (Nov. 11 Dec. 6, 2019)

The "Recommendations for Minimizing Cyber Risk" document is attached here, along with an order form for requesting copies.

Your assistance in distributing this information will go a long way in maintaining public trust in our elections and minimizing the risk of cyber threats.

Recommendations for Minimizing Cyber Risk

Political parties, candidates and elections administrators cannot be alone in the fight against malicious actors who seek to undermine our elections. As political campaigns and organizations are targets of cyber threats, they too have a role and responsibility in defending our democracy. **Your actions are critical in maintaining public trust in our elections** and minimizing the threat of cyber incidents.

As an integral part of protecting our democracy, I wish to remind you to take preventative measures to reduce the likelihood and severity of cyber incidents.

Recognized best practices for minimizing risk:

- (1) Establish an information security framework that allows your team to identify threats, create safeguards, detect incidents, respond quickly, and recover with resilience;
- (2) Control access to data and information systems; monitor vendors, contractors, and employees; and know what your users are doing with your data;
- (3) Beware of social engineering attempts, such as phishing emails, aimed at acquiring confidential or personal information from phone, email or other communications;
- (4) Educate your employees and volunteers on cybersecurity best practices, including how to recognize a phishing email, creating and maintaining strong passwords or passphrases, utilizing two-factor authentication, and avoiding dangerous applications;
- (5) Ensure your software and hardware security is up to date and properly configured;
- (6) Monitor user activity;
- (7) Back up your data;
- (8) Run regular security audits, assessments, and penetration testing; and
- (9) Monitor social media for false or misleading election information. Report such posts to social media platforms and the <u>California Secretary of State's Office of Election Cybersecurity</u> at cybersecurity.sos.ca.gov.

Voting Systems: OVSTA Monthly Update –April 2021

Each month, the Office of Voting Systems Technology Assessment (OVSTA) provides an update on Election Assistance Commission (EAC) and Secretary of State (SOS) activities related to voting technology.

Each update provides information on:

- Voting technology related events that may be of interest.
- Administrative approval requests and denials since the prior month's update.
- Voting technology testing and approval at the SOS office.
- Defect, failure, and fault reports issued since the prior month's update.
- Ballot printing certification requests since the prior month's update.

Voting Technology Testing and Approvals

OVSTA receives and reviews applications for certification and approval from voting technology vendors on a continuous basis. The status of current applications can be found below:

Administrative Approval Requests and Approvals

OVSTA has received an application for modification of the Hart Verity Voting 3.1.1 voting system. The modifications include replacement of workstations, tablets and printers that are end-of-life and no longer available.

Testing and Certification at the EAC

The EAC had been collaborating with public working groups and hosting public hearings to discuss the development of the next iteration of the VVSG, called the Voluntary Voting System Guidelines (VVSG) 2.0 requirements. The meetings included presentations on NIST staff transitions, the RABET-V pilot program, and an open discussion on non-voting election technology approaches. On February 10, 2021, the EAC adopted the Voluntary Voting System Guidelines (VVSG) 2.0. More information on the VVSG 2.0 requirements are available here.

The EAC provides <u>updates</u> on voting system testing. The latest update from the EAC was provided on March 19, 2021. However, based upon discussions with vendors, no systems currently undergoing testing and certification at the EAC are relevant to California.

Additional information regarding each voting system are available at: "Voting Systems Under Test" and "Certified Voting Systems".

Defects, Failures, and Faults

No defects, faults or failures were reported in March.

Ballot Printing Certification Requests and Approvals

OVSTA received an application from ProVoteSolutions, requesting certification for printing of Election Systems & Software, LLC., (ES&S) Election Ware ballots. The application has been approved.

OVSTA received an application from Toppan Merrill, requesting certification for printing of Dominion ImageCast ballots. The application is currently in the initial review phase.

No Ballot on Demand applications were submitted in March.

Electronic Poll Book Certification Requests and Approvals

Notes and Reminders

Election Record Retention- As a reminder, pursuant to California Elections Code sections 17301-17306, the retention and preservation of election records, which includes digital ballot images is 22 months. Several voting system tabulation components are capable of producing digital ballot images. Additional information regarding how to backup, retain, and preserve the digital ballot images, and whether or not your jurisdiction's voting system has this capability, can be found in the respective Use Procedures, here.

Disposal or Sale of Equipment- Regarding the disposal or sale of equipment:

- In 2012, the California Secretary of State issued guidance regarding the disposition or sale of equipment purchased with HAVA and/or VMB funding. See Secretary of State (SOS) County Clerk/Registrar of Voters (CC/ROV) Memorandum #12219 Handling the Sale and Funds from the Sale of Voting Systems or Voting Equipment. The document outlines proper disposal or sale procedures of voting systems or voting equipment purchased with HAVA and/or VMB funding. The document also highlights that all equipment must be void of any software or firmware and returned to a condition of a non-functioning piece of hardware prior to its disposal or sale.
